Allow them time to read and discuss the cases in small groups, and then share their findings with the class. In groups, have learners analyze the scenarios, identify potential ethical dilemmas, and propose strategies to address them.  Discuss the importance of effective enforcement mechanisms and the role of law enforcement agencies, judiciary, and anti-corruption commissions.  If possible, invite a guest speaker from an anti-corruption organization or law enforcement agency to share their experiences and insights on combating bribery and corruption.
