PHASE I: STARTER	Revise with learners to review their understanding in the previous lesson.						
PHASE 2: MAIN	Share performance indicators with learners. Briefly introduce the specific significance of tourism in Ghana, giving examples of popular tourist attractions in the country such as the Kakum National Park, Cape Coast Castle, and Lake Volta. Divide learners into small groups and ask them to discuss and list the ways they think tourism might contribute to the socio-economic development of Ghana. After the groups have discussed, have a representative from each group present their ideas. Write these ideas on the board for everyone to see. Present a mini-lecture discussing the ways in which tourism contributes to the socio-economic development of Ghana. Discuss the creation of jobs, increase in foreign exchange earnings, infrastructure development, and preservation of cultural heritage. Compare the learners' initial ideas with the information in the mini-lecture, noting similarities and differences. Distribute printed case studies about tourism in Ghana. Ask the learners to analyze the case studies in their groups and identify ways in which the tourism industry has positively affected socio-economic development.						and

	After the group work, conduct a class discussion on the case studies. Ask each group to present their findings and facilitate a class discussion.
