Discuss her role (Khadijah) in supporting and protecting Prophet Muhammad.  Emphasize her contributions, including financial support and her role as a trusted advisor.  Divide learners into small groups and assign each group a different influential woman in Islam.  Ask them to research and discuss the roles played by the woman assigned to their group.
